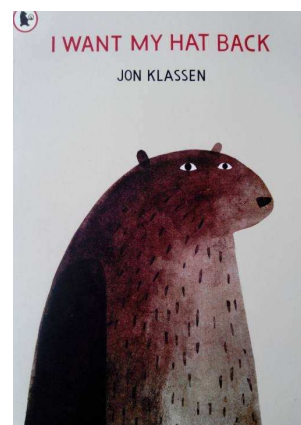


I WANT MY HAT BACK

Pages 15, 16	Nobody has seen my hat. What if I never see it again ? What if nobody ever finds it ? My poor hat. I miss it so much.

Pages 17, 18 (<i>deer</i>)	What's the matter ? I have lost my hat. And nobody has seen it. What does your hat look like ? It is red and pointy and...
Pages 19, 20	I HAVE SEEN MY HAT.
Pages 21, 22	<i>Bear running.</i>
Pages 23, 24	YOU. YOU STOLE MY HAT.
Pages 25, 26	<i>Bear and Rabbit looking at each other.</i>
Pages 27, 28	I love my hat.
Pages 29, 30	Excuse me, have you seen a rabbit wearing a hat ? No. Why are you asking me. I haven't seen him. I haven't seen any rabbits anywhere. I would not eat a rabbit. Don't ask me any more questions. OK. Thank you anyway.
